1. Administration

- a. A formal announcement has not been made as to the new President. **A special election meeting will take place in September to determine. Information will go out in August.**

2. Preparedness Committee

- a. Several functions have been added to the Preparedness Committee.
 - i. Funding: Not actively pursuing funding opportunities but should be alert for possibilities.
 - ii. Equipping: This currently pertains to Volunteer Registration Centers but is a generic function.
 - iii. Facilities: This is also a generic function and can pertain to Volunteer Registration Centers and pet shelters.
- b. Training & Exercises
 - i. Tom Vencl of Geauga County Disaster Services is working with UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) to provide training about personal preparedness, protecting church property, and engaging in disaster ministries. **Serena met with Tom and UMCOR and discussed the training. The workshop will last up to 4-hours. Workshops will take place in Geauga CO and then Cuyahoga in late Fall.**
 - ii. COAD is participating in the National Disaster Medical System (NDMS) exercise on August 14-15 at Burke Lakefront Airport. NDMS is a federal process to evacuate disaster survivors to cities where they receive medical care that is unavailable in the disaster-affected area. Cleveland is an evacuation city because of its wealth of medical facilities. COAD will be testing its Volunteer Registration Center plan. We will need 130 volunteers to act as patients and to perform NDMS tasks. Serena Steele will be managing this project. Stand by for more information. **OEM has reached out to CERTS and other volunteer agencies.**

3. Mass Care Committee

- a. Repatriation Subcommittee (moved under mass care)
 - i. Waiting for the State of Ohio and City of Cleveland to complete their repatriation plan, so Cuyahoga County can develop a consistent plan, and COAD can determine its role.
- b. Functional Needs Subcommittee (moved under mass care)
 - i. Nothing pending. The Subcommittee is focusing on sharing information on functional needs issues as it becomes available.
- c. Animals Subcommittee (moved under mass care)
 - i. The Animals Subcommittee met on Friday, June 8, 2018, 10:00a-12:00p, at the Independence Public Library. They reviewed a first draft of a pet shelter guide.
 - ii. Stacey Short and Jody Kowalski have contacts with veterinarians who might be interested in volunteering.
 - iii. The next training session for the Animal Decontamination Group will be in the Fall 2018 (TBA).

- iv. The Animals Subcommittee will continue to identify organizations to fill roles and responsibilities that were identified in the Animals in Disaster Plan. The Subcommittee will need to develop its public awareness campaign, which will inform the public about pet preparedness and sheltering.
- v. The City of Cleveland is also developing a pet sheltering guide.
- e. Faith-Based Organizations (FBO) Subcommittee
 - i. FBO Objectives:
 1. Prepare congregants for disasters.
 2. Plan for the continued operation of the organization.
 3. Enhance security at houses of worship.
 4. Extend everyday ministries to disaster situations within the congregation and in the community.
 5. Network and coordinate with other FBOs, community organizations, and local government.
 6. Connect with the national/state/regional disaster response group within the faith.
 7. Learn emergency management principles and operate within the emergency management system.
 8. Receive planning guidelines, training, resources, and technical assistance.
 - ii. See Preparedness Committee, Training and Exercises above regarding UMCOR training.
- f. Volunteers Subcommittee
 - i. The Subcommittee objectives will be to
 1. Network organizations that can provide volunteers or will need volunteers for a disaster response;
 2. Integrate voluntary organizations into the county emergency management system;
 3. Plan for the operation of a Volunteer Registration Center;
 4. Credential volunteers according to FEMA guidelines; and
 5. Provide training.
 - ii. The Volunteers Subcommittee has not officially launched, but volunteers will be recruited for the NDMS exercise (see Preparedness Committee, Training and Exercises above). **COAD plans to convene a volunteer committee after the NDMS exercise in August.**



4. Recovery Committee (formerly Human Services)

- a. Planning for a long-term recovery has begun. This will be an extensive project that will require the collaboration of many organizations. There are four model's of long-term recovery groups from least formal to most formal: (1) Unmet Needs Committee; (2) Long-Term Recovery Committee; (3) Long-Term Recovery Organization; and (4) Community Coalition for Recovery. We will focus on the first two models because they are the one most likely to be needed in our area. We will be examining the roles of governmental and non-governmental organizations and integrating them into a case management system. We will be following the FEMA and VOAD models.
- b. **Evacuation and Re-entry Subcommittee**
 - i. **Waiting for an instructor to become available in 2018 for the *Evacuation and Re-entry Planning* course.**
- c. OEM staff has met with 211 who can assist with case management processes.
- d. OEM staff met with ARC and has determined that there should be a meeting of organizations to discuss recovery processes and also establish a committee that will encompass all phases of recovery that include immediate, short and long-term needs. This committee will then be under COAD.
- e. Serena Steele/OEM has assumed management of this project and will be assisted by Mike Arthur of the American Red Cross in Cleveland.
